



Frog loved looking at the stars. He wanted to jump up and touch them. One night, he was determined to touch the stars!




He climbed a big rock, and reached out for them. But they were out of his reach. The stars were SO far away!




Then, he saw a hillock. Up he climbed. He stretched his hands, but the stars were still out of reach.




Frog saw a coconut tree nearby. It was very tall. Ah, he thought this will work now.
