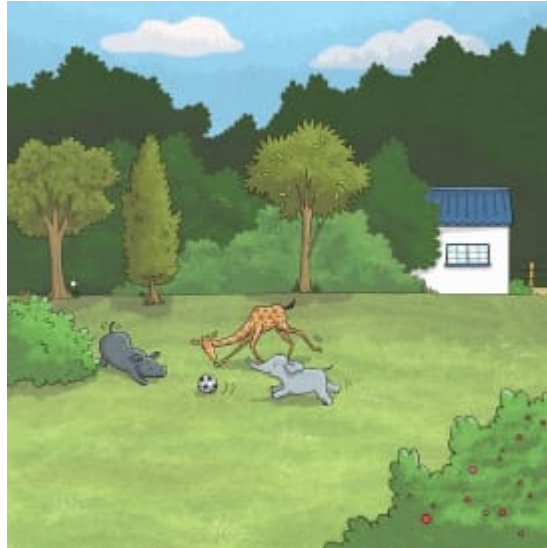

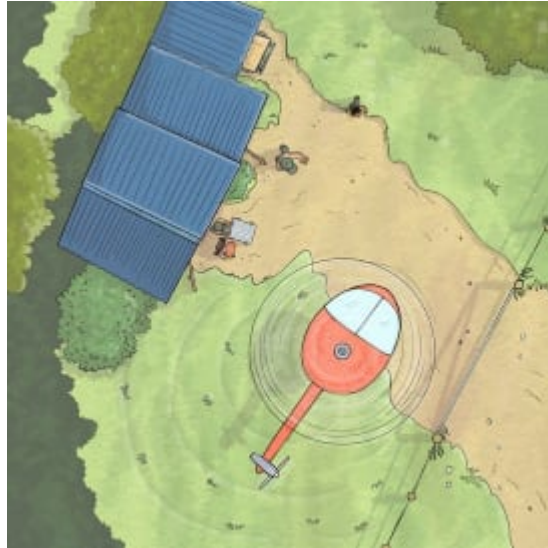
This is the story of Keeper and his nursery for orphaned animals.
