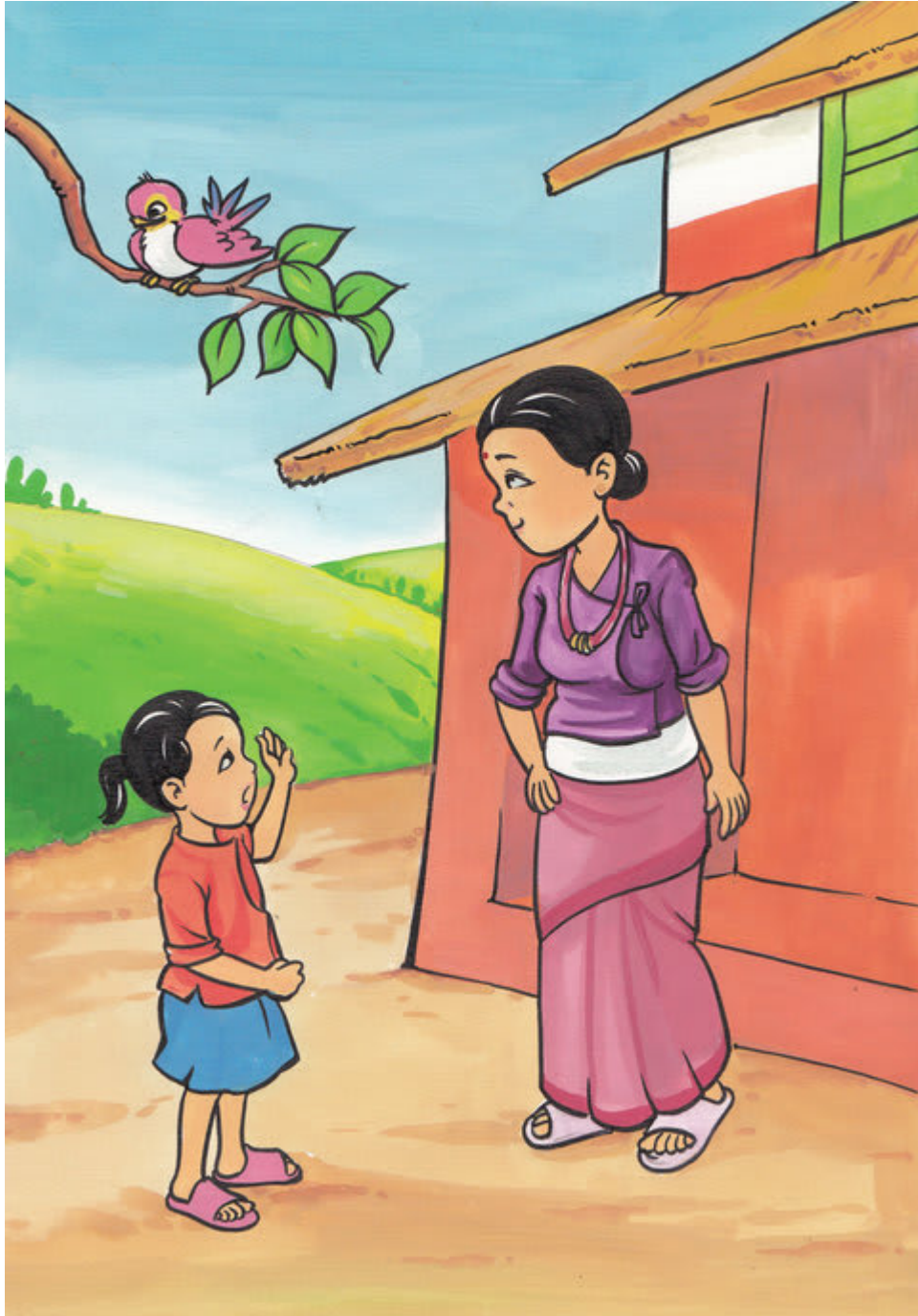

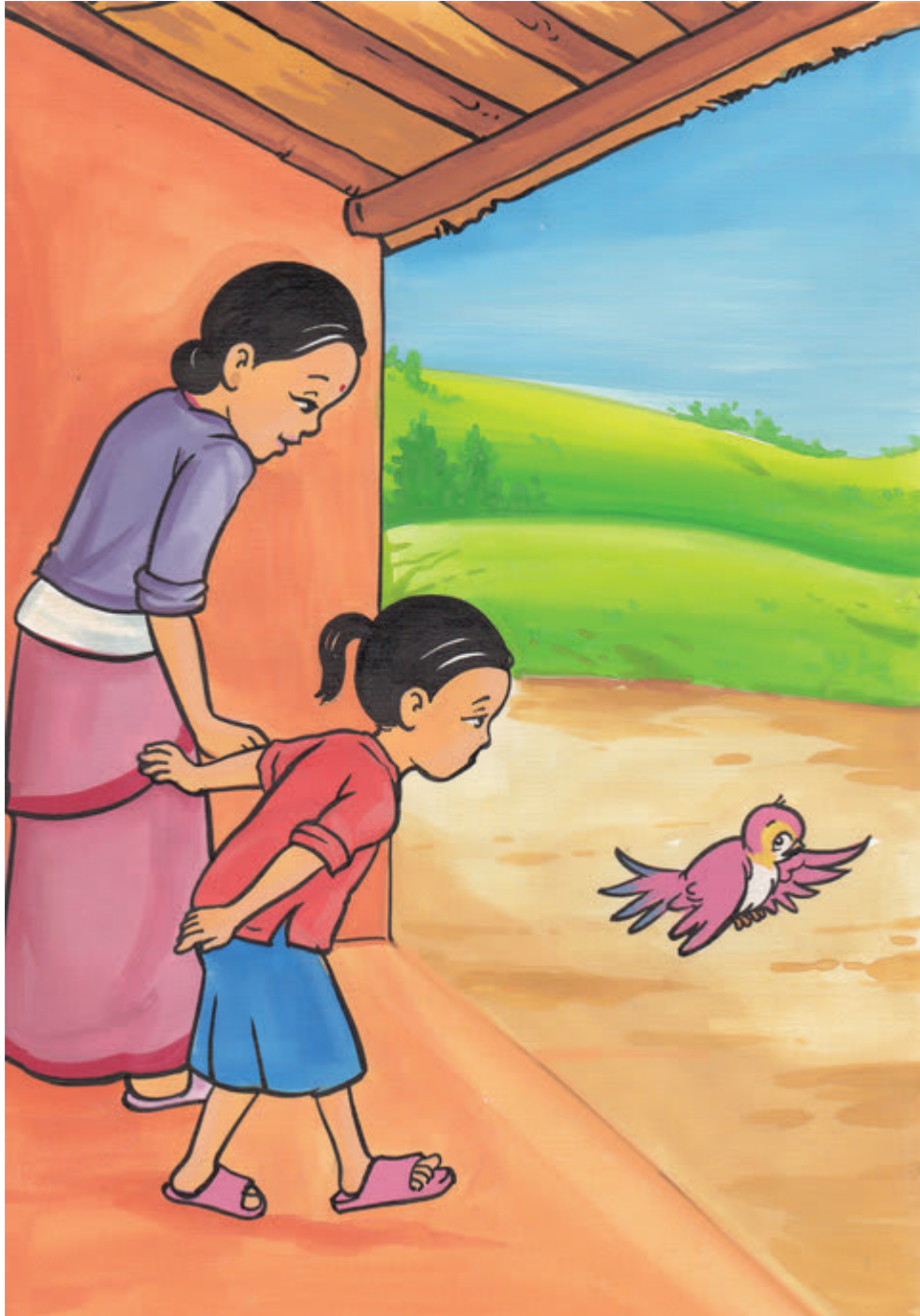
Mother! Please call the bird that lives in that tree.



Mother! Please throw the bird some grains so that it comes to us.



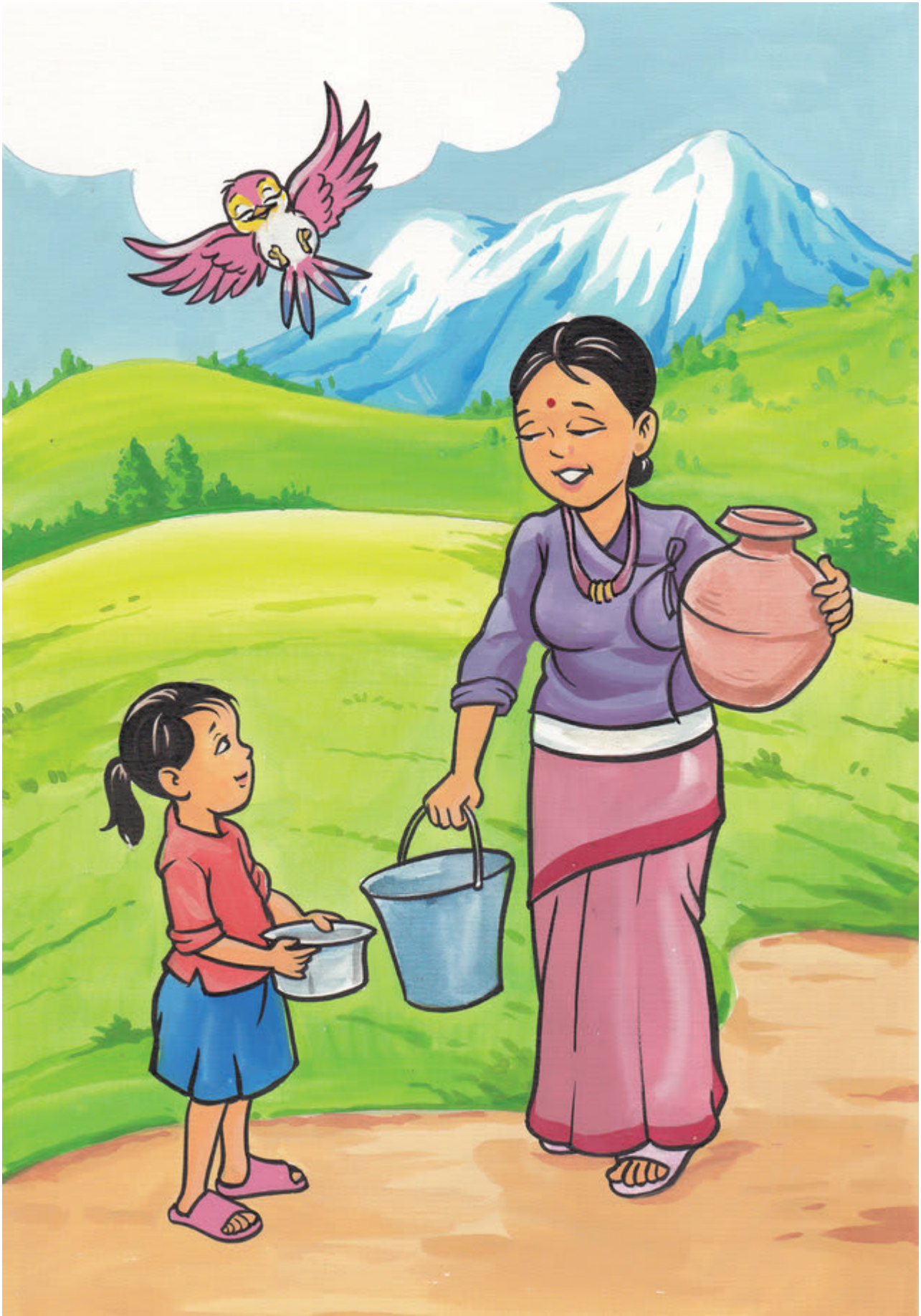
Mother! I want see how the bird eats the grains.
