



Papa and the Snake


The pictures tell this very funny story. What does Papa do when he sees a snake? What does the snake do when it sees Papa?

One day Papa was sitting at home. "Help!" said Papa. "I see a snake!"




Papa got on top of the table. The snake got on top of the table too.

Papa climbed up a tree. The snake climbed up a tree too.




Papa jumped down. The snake jumped down too.




Papa went back to the house. He got an axe.

Snake bite What to do if you are bitten by a snake Step 1. Wrap a bandage around the bite. Start from the fingers or toes. Keep bandaging as far as you can reach.




Step 2. Put a splint (a long stick) on the arm of leg. The splint will keep the arm or leg still. This will slow the spreading of the snake venom through the body.




Step 3. Wait for help or carry the person to help.



What NOT to do if you are bitten by a snake Do not cut or wash the bite. Do not try to suck the venom out of the wound. Do not try to catch the snake.
