


**Peter's Peanuts**

At home, Peter planted the peanuts. He gave them water. He watched the leaves grow. Then he watched the flowers grow. He watched the peanuts grow.




At last it was time to dig them up. Peter cooked the peanuts in the fire. He added oil, salt, ginger and herbs. He put the peanuts into bags.
