

All the other fruit at the market were a beautiful red.







Green Apple wants to be red, too.



One night, Green Apple couldn't sleep. She tried to think of a plan.




She tiptoed up to Red Tomato. She took his jacket!




The next morning, Red Tomato was furious when he realized that his jacket was gone.

Green Apple took off the jacket. She gave it back.




But Green Apple did not give up! She befriended Strawberry.




That night, Green Apple sneaked up to Strawberry. Strawberry opened one eye and asked, "What are you up to?"

He touched Green Apple with the tip of his tail. Green Apple turned purple!


"You gave me the wrong leaves," Chameleon sighed.



Green Apple went to the mountain. But it was so high! She collected leaves from the bottom of the mountain instead. She took them back to Chameleon.




"I am sorry," said Green Apple.
