Waves in the water, waves in her hair. Mushrooms on tree trunks, birds in the air.




Words in a book that can take her to places, full of new colours, new stories, new faces.



Things of the colour that she loves best - RED! The three wiggly hairs on her brother Boo's head.




Sprinkles on the cake Daddy baked today, like the stars that twinkle at her from far away.
