Count to ten with colorful animals and objects. What else can help you count to ten?



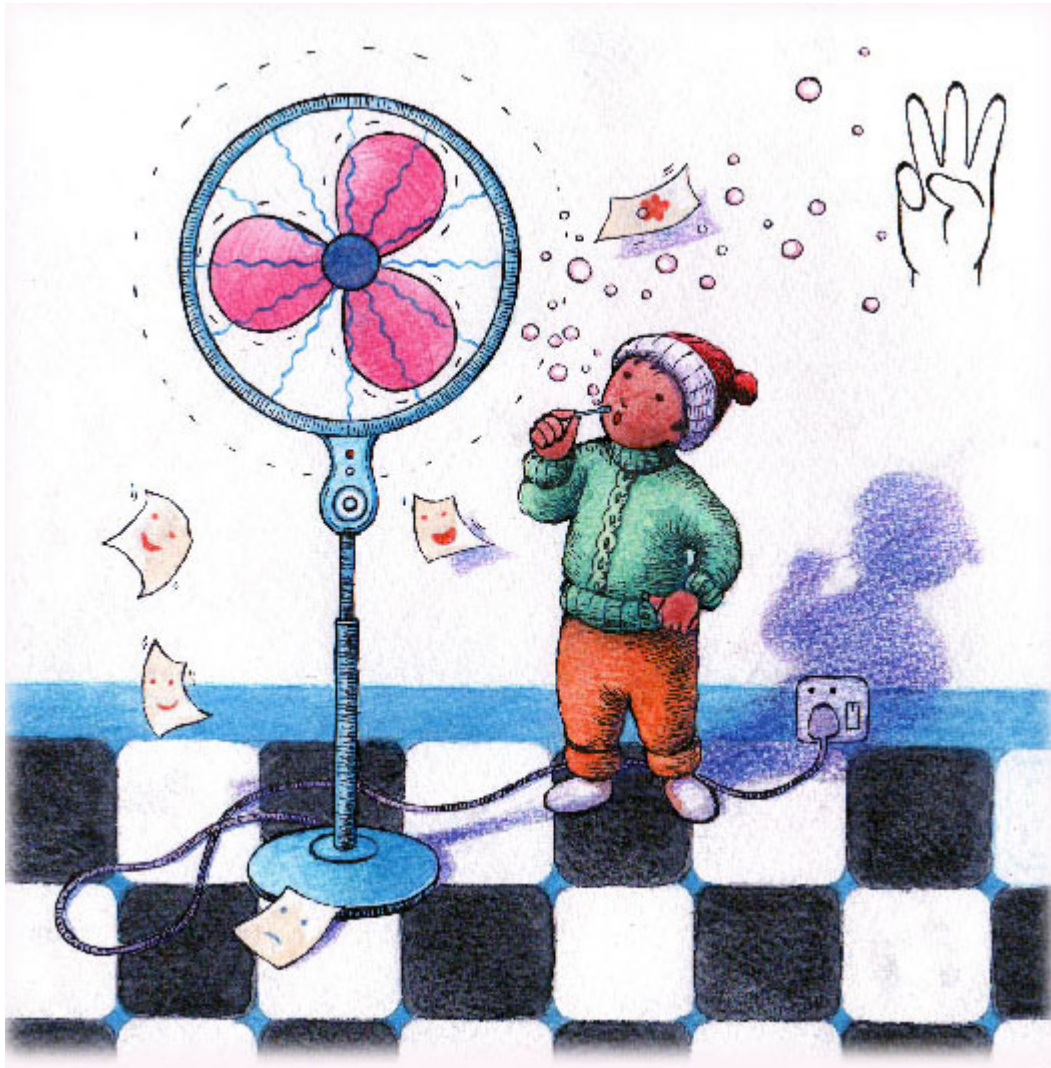
