


## **Cat and Dog Learn Every Day**

Can Cat learn how to swim? Read about how Cat's friends teach him a valuable lesson.





And then... Cat swims! She says, "Wow! I can swim!"




Frog says, "It is amazing, Cat! Because Dog is not holding the wood anymore!"

Cat climbs the tree and sits next to Frog. But Dog does not climb the tree. Dog stays on the ground.




Frog asks, "Dog, why do you not climb the tree?" Dog answers, "I was not born a climber..."



Bye-bye, Cat. Bye-bye, Dog. Bye-bye, Frog.


