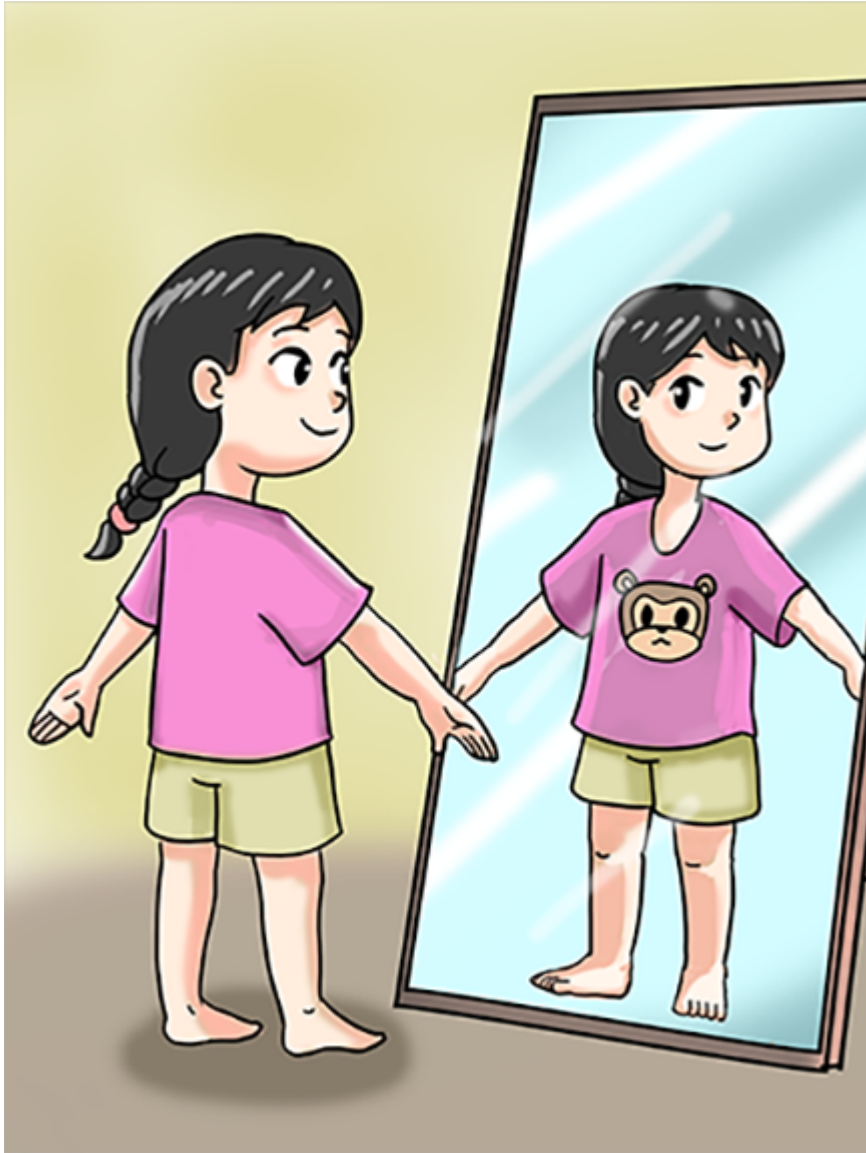
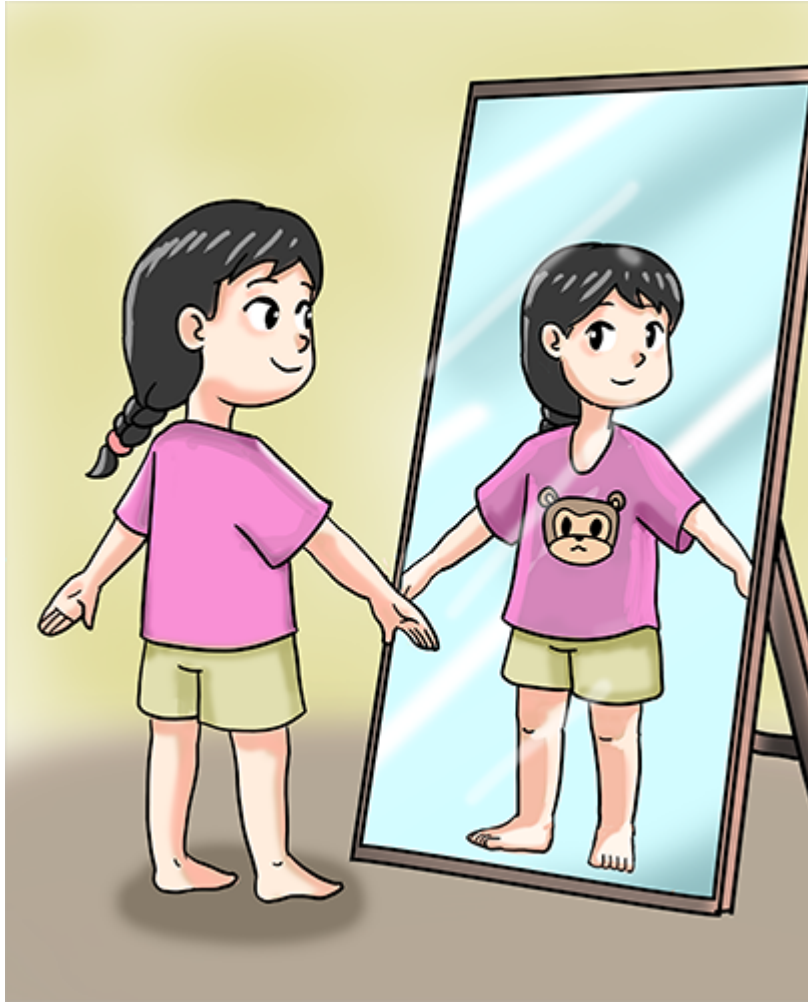


My Body

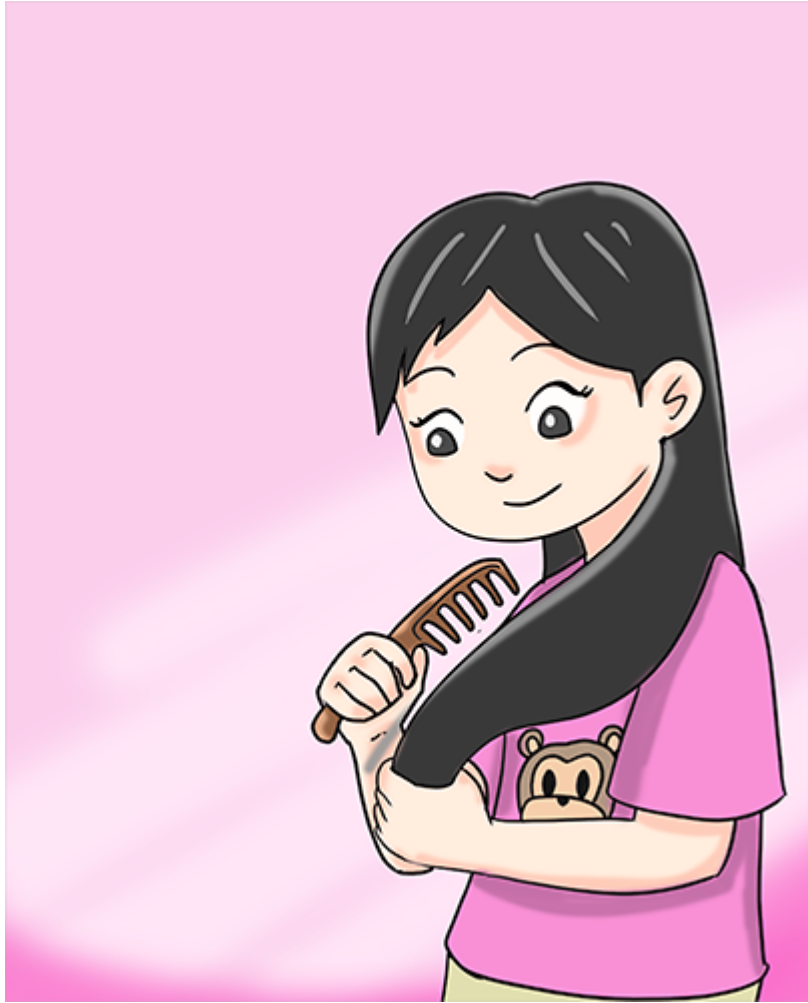
Our bodies are made of different parts. What do we use them for?



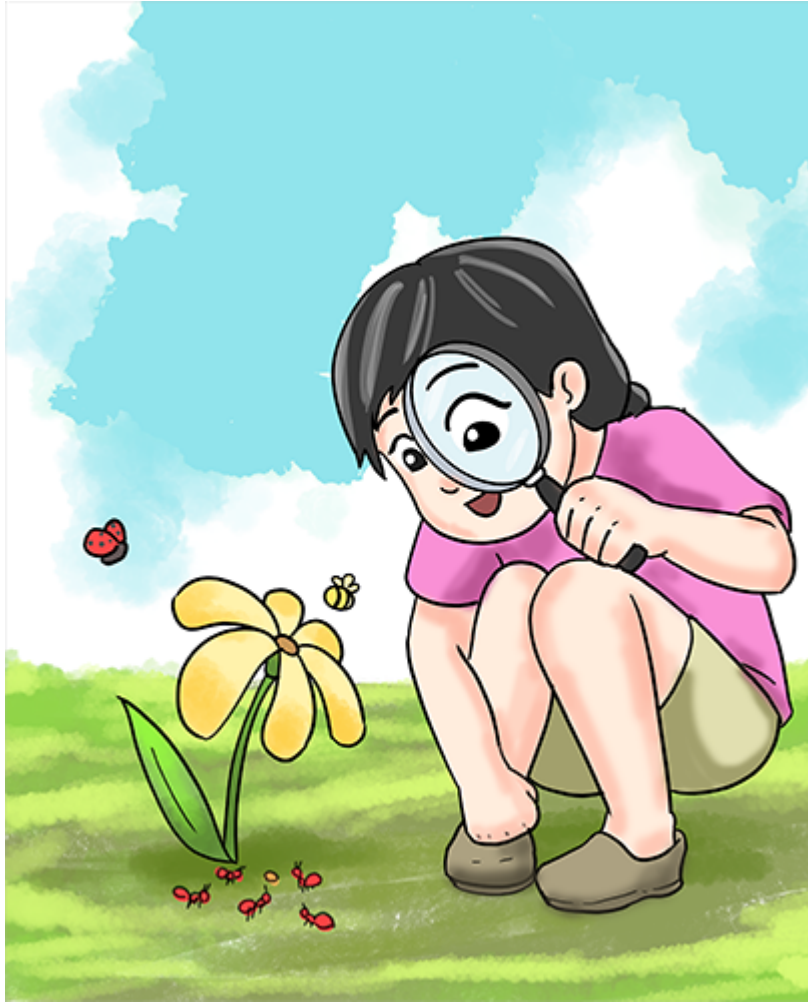

This is my body.



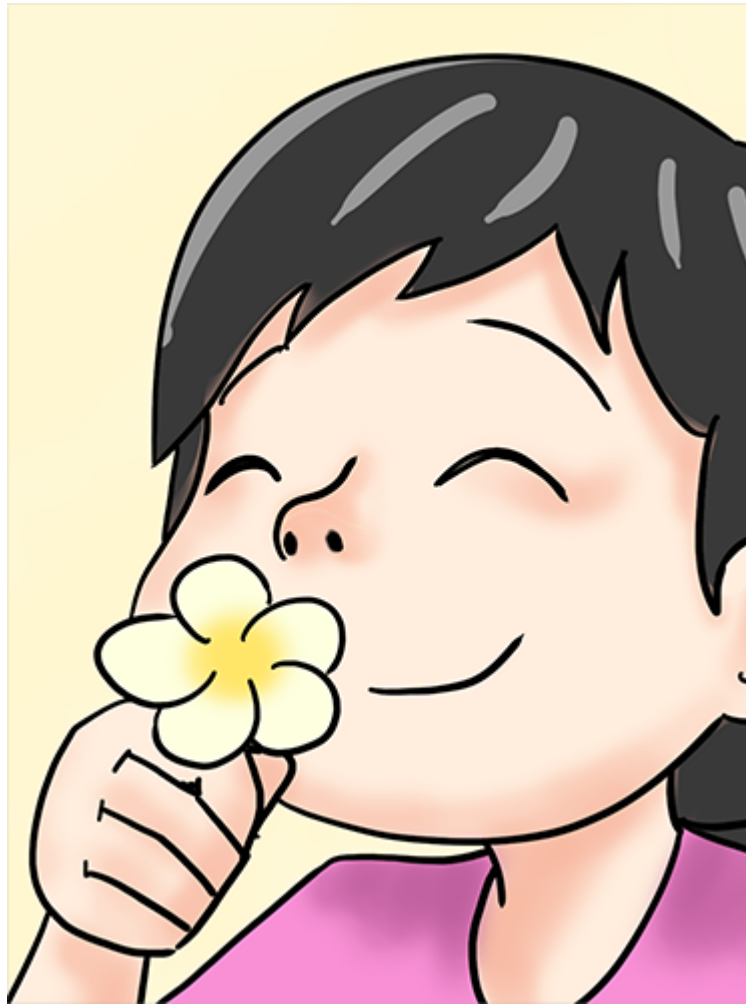
This is my hair. My hair protects my scalp.
