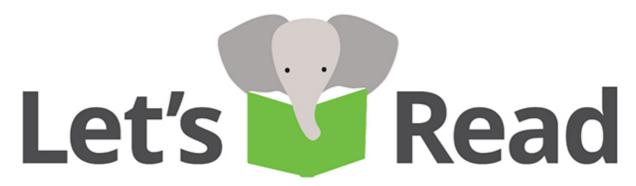


McGaiver the Galactic Taxi Driver


It has been a long day for Max the Taxi Driver. He has been carrying passengers from galaxy to galaxy for light years and is ready to go see his family.

Max is relieved, thinking the old man must be the owner of the box.





"Let's ask Dad if he can stay and play!" the third suggests.




When their father appears, he recognizes Max and his taxi, and says hello.
