
## **Vroom! Vroom!**

Today is Alma and Biru's first day taking orders as a motorcycle taxi. However, they face many challenges along the way. Can they get the job done?










Biru was waiting for Alma to finish her classes. There she was! Biru and

Alma were going to take orders as an online motorcycle taxi. It was their first day. Biru was worried. Could he handle it?




"Let's get ready," Alma said. Gasoline? Check! Oil? Check! Tires?

Pitter, patter! What's that? Rain! The cakes can't get wet!




The cakes were safe. However, Biru got a bit worried. What if Alma got

Biru gazed at the passing motorcycles. Their drivers looked tough. They


drove on even as the rain fell harder. Biru glanced at Alma. She also looked tough. He knew they could do that too!




Vroom, vroom! Biru's engine turned on. Let's deliver these cakes.
