
"Hey! Hanah, can you come out now? It's really hard to find you when you're the one hiding,"Tim complained as they searched for Hanah.


"Hanah, can you be it this time?" Tim asked "Hmm! Okay sure, I'll be it this time," Hanah agreed.


"Where did they hide?" Hanah wondered. She hopped on her left foot as she thoroughly searched the area. "They're not here."




She got on all fours and searched further. "They're not here either," Hanah said. "Wow! both of you are so good at hiding!"

"Oh no! What am I going to do? Should I hide?" Hanah thought. "I need to help my friends. How can I save them?"




